***How would these decisions affect you?***

Uwchlan is currently pursuing combining its two wastewater treatment facilities into one. The plan is to decommission the Eagleview plant and purchase 50K gallons of sewer capacity from the Downingtown Regional treatment plant while framework is built to redirect the Eagleview flows to Downingtown.

The township was recently awarded a \$57,500 grant from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to put together a comprehensive park, recreation, and open space plan that looks at enhancing open space, preserving natural resources, and improving existing parks. The plan would be created using a 20–25-person steering committee comprised of community members.

The township zoning task force is currently evaluating existing and emerging land uses to determine the appropriate zoning districts for those uses. The township is also currently working with Chester County on a buildout analysis to assess remaining undeveloped and redevelopment properties to guide future land use and planning, **which would include discussions on data centers**, utility infrastructure limitations, and PECO's ability to meet the demands of large-scale electrical service to high-demand users.

The May 11 Board of Supervisors public comment portion of the meeting brought to light community concerns regarding the Pennypacker Country Club pickleball courts. The township appears to have imposed an arbitrary 50 decibel level requirement for the pickleball courts that does not appear in any township noise ordinance.

A land development plan for 35K square foot commercial use warehouse mirroring the one next door on Haywood Drive has been submitted to the township for review.

***Are you aware that Chester County enacted a Human Relations Ordinance?***

On December 23, 2025, Chester County enacted Ordinance No. ORD-2025-03, establishing county-wide non-discrimination requirements and allowing for the creation of the Chester County Human Relations Commission. In addition to the broad anti-discrimination protections Pennsylvanians already enjoy under both federal law and the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act (PHRA), this commission, composed of 7 to 13 volunteers appointed by the county commissioners, is given the authority to investigate, conciliate, adjudicate, issue subpoenas, and enforce compliance with the ordinance using civil fines of up to \$500 per violation. Decisions can be appealed to the Chester County Court of Common Pleas.

Expanded protected classes within this ordinance that are not covered under the PHRA include citizenship status, gender expression, marital status, familial status, source of income, age, veteran status, and domestic or sexual violence victim status.

The ordinance was approved in a two-to-one vote, with Commissioners Josh Maxwell and Marian Moskowitz voting in favor and Commissioner Eric Roe voting against.
